Containers, packaging, printed matter and newspapers

PAPER AND CARDBOARD

- ▶ newspapers, flyers, magazines
- ▶ paper sheets, envelopes and bags
- ▶ books, phonebooks
- ▶ cardboard rolls
- ▶ cardboard boxes
- ▶ egg cartons
- ▶ gable top milk and juice cartons
- ▶ aseptic containers (Tetra Pak™ type)



PLASTIC

- ▶ bottles, containers and wrappings for food products, drinks, cosmetics, personal hygiene products and household cleaning products featuring one of these symbols:



- ▶ caps and lids
- ▶ bags and plastic wrappers



GLASS

- ▶ bottles and jars, regardless of colour



METAL

- ▶ aluminum foil and containers
- ▶ aluminum bottles and cans
- ▶ tin cans
- ▶ caps and lids

Recycling Tips

Consider reducing and reusing before putting items in your recycling bin

Rinse plastic bags and containers soiled with food using your remaining dishwater

Remove flyers and receipts from plastic bags

Empty and stuff all soft plastic bags and plastic wrappers into one plastic bag and tie with a knot

Do not place paper or cardboard soiled with grease, oil or food in the recycling bin

Separate the different types of packaging used in a product (e.g. remove plastic liners from cereal boxes)

Labels and windows from envelopes don't need to be removed
